THE SUMMER SCHOOL 'INSTITUTION'

In the context of our social contribution, we ran the 'Summer School' for the first time on July 2nd, 2018 to keep occupied employees' and neighboring communities' children, aged 6-12 years old.

The Summer School is hosted in Zygi elementary school facilities and is open for two months, July-August, from 7.00' until 16.00'; it is staffed with five teachers, fully trained for the education, care and protection of children.

Children have the opportunity to constructively use their time during the summer period, by developing skills and gaining knowledge through creative activities, team spirit, respect and cooperation while forging new friendships at the same time.

The School's weekly program includes activities, such as sports (judo, taekwondo, gymnastics, football), artistic (dance, music, theater), group activities (cooking, confectionery, games) and excursions.

In cooperation with organized groups (BirdLife Cyprus, Clap3C, Terra Cypria, etc), we enrich our activities range by adding pottery, science and mathematics, environment-related activities, workshops with a child psychologist, and useful educational programs on personal hygiene and first aid by our Company's nurse.


On Tuesday, January 14th, 2020 the annual Holy blessing of waters and the cutting of Santa Claus cake took place in the Company to celebrate the new year.

Our solar park with a capacity of 8MWp was set in operation in February 2020. This project is part of the plan 'RES-fired electricity generation with outcome the inclusion of projects in the Competitive Electricity Market' by the Ministry of Energy, Commerce and Industry and is expected to cover 10% of our Company's needs in electricity.

Did you know that ...

The solar park is considered 'green growth' and contributes to Cyprus national targets attainment for 2020 and the mitigation of carbon dioxide emissions (CO2), since it is estimated that it shall prevent the release of circa 10,000 tons of CO2 per year.

The upgrade of that underlying area in an inactive quarry, owned by our Company, into this 'green' project is part of corporate responsibility.

STANDING BY YOUNG PEOPLE Career Guidance Information Days

In 2018, our Company established the 'Information Days on Engineering' addressed to students of B' and C' grade of Upper Secondary School and Technical Schools, in cooperation with the Technical Chamber of Cyprus (ETEK) and the Career Counseling and Educational Services (CCES) of the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports & Youth.

The Information Days are held at the Company's facilities; the speakers who are engineers of different specializations (Mechanical Engineers, Chemical Engineers, Electrical Engineers etc) and representatives from the Technical Chamber of Cyprus (ETEK), aim at informing students on the Engineering-related professions. Ten (10) conferences have taken place so far with the participation of 255 students in total from Upper Secondary schools and Technical Schools of Cyprus. For the academic year 2019-2020, the conferences have been completed and a new round will begin in the next academic year.

During the Information Days, students are presented with various engineering-related professions by the Company's representatives, placing emphasis on the particularities of professions and how such features are utilized in a heavy industry. Students are, then, given a guided tour at the facilities, observing the way of working in every profession and are given answers to any queries raised.

The Information Days were held and became established in the context of the Company's regular activities for the academic community's briefing on the Mechanical Engineering developments.






5 EMBLEMATIC WOMEN WHO MADE HISTORY

MARIE CURIE (1867 - 1934)

A woman milestone in the science of physics and chemistry. The first woman to have been awarded a Nobel Prize in Physics (1903) regarding radioactivity.

AMELIA EARHART (1897 - 1937)

An American pioneer of aviation, author and defender of women's rights. The first woman who crossed the Atlantic Ocean alone.

MOTHER TERESA (1910-1997)

A woman who linked her name to social contribution and help to poor people.

BENAZIR BHUTTO (1953-2017)

The first woman to be a Prime Minister in a Muslim country. She took over the leadership of Pakistan in 1988, seeking to establish democracy after the coup.

MALALA YOUSAFZAI (1997-)

In 2013, she was awarded the Sakharov Prize and was a candidate for the Nobel Peace Prize; finally, in 2014 she was granted the Nobel Peace Prize for her fight to defend the right of children in education.

Games reminiscent of a different era







The Easter traditional games are numerous, and we chose to remind you of some in order to stir up memories for the elderly and to teach the younger ones. Young ones and older ones used to take part in those games in the days close to Resurrection Day. Some of those games faded in time but others have survived until today.

VASSILITZIA TZAI MYRITZIA

Players are split in two teams of equal number of players. Each team may include from two up to ten players.

A draw determines which team will take over the role of 'vasilitzia', i.e whose members would mount on the backs of the other team's members.

One player mounts on the back of the other and raising his finger, shouts 'Vasilitiza, how many...'. The player below, without being able to see, should guess how many fingers are up. If the answer is correct, then they switch positions; otherwise they continue until the correct answer is given.

MYLONAS TZAI MYLONOU (the miller and the miller's wife)

Besides the abundant laughter enjoyed with the game, the players have the chance to stimulate their wittiness and readiness, in order to respond swiftly and accurately to challenges.

Players mutually choose their partner; preferably a team should consist of a boy and a girl. They stand in a circle, making pairs facing inwards and they tell their names. One couple, usually the one with the highest experience in the game, as acknowledged by the rest, is the miller and the miller's wife.

The miller opens the game with a spontaneous phrase such as 'I thresh the grain, I sieve, the wheat to be taken to the mill by....', or 'I harvest, I thresh, In order to make flour, the wheat to be brought to the mill by.....' mentioning obviously the name of someone from the other players besides the miller's wife, i.e his partner.

Immediately, the person who heard his name should seek ways to avoid the tedious task, putting forward an excuse and picking someone else out of the players to do it. Similarly, the player whose name was mentioned should try to avoid the task trying to encumber another player and so on and so forth.

If the player whose turn is to answer fails to realize that he should answer or delays for more than 3 seconds to answer, he/she and his/ her partners are sanctioned and the penalty is imposed unanimously by the miller, the miller's wife and the couple that invited said player.

If the player who failed to take the challenge is the miller or the miller's wife, then they are deprived of this prerogative. Their position is taken up by the couple that provoked the couple and a new round of game begins.

AVGOULLODROMIES (Egg race)

The players who participate must balance a (boiled) egg upon a spoon and race with it covering a specific itinerary. The aim is to reach the finishing line without the egg falling.



DITZIMIN (weight-lifting game)

A game played by the most well-built and strong men during the days of big feasts. The game's aim was to showcase and honor the strongest lad of the village.

As an object, 'ditzimin' is a heavy stone up to 120 kilos (100 oka), a size that can fit in someone's embrace; the stone comes from a river or from fragments of an old mill stone.

Any man who wants to compete by showing his strength may take part in the game. Each player, in the order derived by a draw, is called upon to lift the stone and take as many steps as possible, holding the stone. The winner is the player who can obviously move 'ditzimin' further.

There is however a different version of the game when 'ditzimin' is too heavy; the player is not called upon to move it horizontally but only to lift it. The winner is the player who shall manage to lift it higher.

This movement is described by the phrase 'he dragged it above his shoulder'.

ZIZIROS (Cicada)

One person stands in a middle of the group with his/her left hand under his/her right arm with opened fingers. With his/her right palm, the player covers the right eye so as not to look back. The other players stand behind at a short distance and one of them taps the person on the back. After the tap, this person turns back immediately in order to guess who hit him/ her. After the hit the rest of the players make a "ZZZZ" sound like a cicada (ziziros) and wave their right index, so as to confuse the player who was hit. If he/she is correct, then this person will take his/her place. If not, he/ she must continue until the guess is correct.



THE SYMBOLISM BEHIND THE EASTER CUSTOMS

In addition to Easter games, let us now turn to the symbolisms deriving from the customs related to the Easter days. Customs traveled through time from generation to generation and are inextricably linked to our tradition.

Symbolisms are numerous; we chose to present some of them, as you will see below:

HOLY LIGHT: It symbolizes the victory of Jesus Christ against death. The custom whereby people receive the Holy Light from the candle of their fellow citizen is a symbol of brotherhood.

RED-DYED EGGS: Dying the eggshells red is associated with two traditions. The first tradition relates to the blood of Jesus that dripped from His forehead when the Romans placed on His head a wreath of thorns. The second tradition relates to a woman who is alleged to have seen miraculously her eggs on the basket turning red, once she heard the news of Jesus Resurrection.

The clinking of red-shelled eggs is a symbol of Resurrection as the egg symbolizes life and creation that envelops life within it. When the eggshell breaks, a life begins symbolizing the breaking of Jesus Sepulcher and His Resurrection.

LILIES: According to the Christian tradition, during the last hours of Jesus life, lilies blossomed every time his sweat dripped.

HARE: A custom that came from Western Europe. We usually come across it in toys and in Easter decoration. The Easter hare comes from the countryside and brings eggs to children. It is a symbol of Spring and of nature's rejuvenation.

LAMBRATZIA: Lambratzia is a ritual symbolism of the burning of evil (Judas) and the advent of good.

TSOUREKI (TRADITIONAL EASTER BREAD): It is a more sophisticated form of Easter bread, of Easter bread roll. This type of bread carries a symbolism because it represents the Resurrection of Christ, in the sense that flour comes to life and transforms into bread. The word tsoureki derives from the Turkish word corek referring to any bread, made of milk, butter and eggs.

FLAOUNA: It derives from the ancient Greek word flao meaning crush. It is a traditional Cypriot Easter food offered after the Resurrection. In Cyprus, flaouna is made since the 19th century.

Flaounes are traditionally served in Cyprus as a celebratory food for the breaking of the Lenten fast. It should be also stressed that flaounas are also prepared by Muslim Turkish Cypriots during the period of Ramadan.

Almost a year ago, a female dog, Sousou, was found in a very bad condition outside our Company's facilities. After a great effort, her 7-day old puppies were tracked down, of which only 5 managed to survive due to thousands of fleas on their bodies. On the same day, three puppies were rescued from a previous birth.

The stray Sousou is 7 years old and was in this condition for many years. Colleagues in the area say that she has given birth may times.

The little dog was facing difficulties to walk due to subluxated kneecaps; she had lost many of her teeth due to the many births and was almost blind. Lead from bullets were identified on her body and two old breaks on the spinal cord. Beneath her dirty fur, one could see a skeletal, long-suffering creature. We have promised to this creature that it will never suffer again, that it will not experience hunger again...!

Sousou managed to be saved thanks to the animal welfare association P.A.W.S (Protecting Animals Without Shelter) and is currently in UK with her foster family that adopted it despite all her problems. Her family loves her a lot and considers Sousou the most beautiful gift to them. She is a very smart dog showing them great love and she has become good friends with her sister, Sriya. She enjoys going on excursions in the countryside, waits for her sister to arrive from school every day with enthusiasm and loves to hear fairytales, at night before they fall asleep.

FIGURES WHO CHANGED THE HISTORY Dimitris Libertis





We wait day and night For air to blow in this Burnt place That never sees freedom We wait for the sumrise To bring the light of the day That will bring Happiness and an ending.

Dimitris Libertis was born in Larnaca in 1866. He was one of the poets who contributed to showcasing the Cypriot dialect. He studied English and French in the Fraternity of Jesuits and in the American College of Beirut. After his return to Cyprus, he worked as a secretary of the courts of Larnaca and in other state services (1885-1899). In 1899 he left for Egypt and then for Naples in Italy, where he attended philosophy and literature classes and he also went to Greece where he attended theology courses at the University of Athens. In 1901, he returned to Cyprus and worked in extraordinary government services and as a teacher (1913-1916). In his first collections of poems 'The relaxed harp' (Halaromeni Lira) in 1891 and 'Stoni' (Στόνοι) in 1899, the influences of the late Greek romanticism of the 19th century are apparent. In 1918, he turned to the Cypriot dialect and in 1923 he published the first volume of the four-volume collection of poems, the 'Cypriot Songs' (Tzipriotika Tragoudia),. In 1930 he published the second volume that was prefaced by Kostis Palamas.

His work largely influenced the popular folk of Cyprus and many subsequent poets. He was an instructor of the Cypriot dialect which he bequeathed in an original form, stripping it of any foreign influences, such as the Turkish words. For some scholars though, this language was considered rather pretentious and 'contrived', far from the actual Cypriot dialect of his era.

Many of his poems were set to music by various composers. In 1931, he was honored with the title 'Officier d' Academie' by the French Academy. Dimitris Libertis died in Nicosia in 1937. In 1961, Libertis 'Collected Works' were published in one volume.



AROMATIC PASTA IN 10 MINUTES

INGREDIENTS

- 500 gr of penne pasta
- 1 tablespoons of olive oil
- 40 gr of pine nuts
- 5-6 sun-dried tomatoes (from a jar with olive oil)
- 4 full tablespoons with pesto basil (ready in a jar)
- 40 gr of grated parmesan

PREPARATION

We boil the penne pasta in a cooking pot with salted water, according to the instructions on the package. When penne are ready, we strain.

In the same cooking pot, we roast the pine nuts with 1 tablespoon of olive oil. We then add the penne and we continue stirring. We chop the sun-dried tomatoes in large pieces, and we add them into the cooking pot alongside the pesto basil and the parmesan.

We stir well and serve.

Green Corner

How to ward off moths from my cloths in a chemically-free way?

1 Essential oils: The essential oils, the dried flowers and the plants' leaves that moths do not favor constitute a good solution with guaranteed results. Place them in a pouch made of linen or cotton and put it in the cloths, in the bags or in the closets. Opt for: Lavender, mint, thyme, rosemary, cedar or wormwood.

2 Spice: Clove put in the cloths or in the pockets is equally effective to ward off moths. Another solution would be to place grains of pepper and place them in an old nylon-made sock. A moth cannot tolerate the smell of most of spice.

3 Sandal wood: Spray a little sandal wood in the drawer or your wardrobe or soak a cotton pad with sandal wood oil.

4 Soap: Do not throw away whatever is left over from the bar of soap. Put it aside and when you collect many pieces, place them in a piece of tulle, or gauze and then put them in the drawer or in the closet. Not only will you have avoided the moths, but your cloths will smell nice.

5 Wooden cloth hangers: Wooden cloth hangers are considered the best because they repeal the moths.

NATURE ESCAPE Location: Holy Mary of Love, Vavla, District of Larnaca

There is always time for a small escape, particularly in nature, when circumstances allow it. The clean air, the landscape and the river that flows take you far away from the stressful daily life.

A small church, built in 1934, is located north to the village Vavla and is dedicated to the Holy Mary of Love. It is the only temple both in Cyprus and in the world bearing this name. This small church is built at 3 km distance from the village, in the Easter bank of Agios Minas river. It is also located in just 46 km distance from the city of Larnaca and in 49 km from Limassol. On the way to the church, in some parts of the route, one will notice that the road is sharply downhill or the opposite and the closer it gets to the church, the narrower it becomes. It is a route running in parallel to the riverbed, where we may stop and admire the deep gorges created by the river.

From the church, a small road leads to a beautiful site by the river, where absolute peace and tranquility prevail. The only thing you will hear is the birdsong competing with the water's ripple sound.

We highly suggest it for a carefree stroll with your beloved ones, enjoy the ride!
